

As readers, we will enjoy reading 'Oliver and the Seawigs' by Philip Reeve which will encompass our learning across our English this term. We will develop our reading skills: predict, explain and summarise. We will read poetry and perform showing understanding of intonation, tone, volume and action. As writers, we will create texts which vary on contents and allow us to expand our knowledge of English skills. We will compose and rehearse sentences orally, progressively building a varied and rich vocabulary and increasing range of sentence structure.

As Historians, we will study the Romans and the impact on Britain. We will look at Julius Caesar and how he tried to invade Britain on two occasions. We will learn about the Roman army and how they grew between 55BC and 42AD. We will discover Emperor Claudius and how he successfully invaded Britain. Then, we will learn about the British resistance including Boudica. Finally, we will learn about the impact that the Roman's had on Britain and how it has lasted to the present day.

In computing, we will be focusing on survey and analysis. We will discover the different types of database for different variations of data. We will retrieve and record some of our data and then present this within a database. We will also be able to present this information using presentation technology.

As artists, we will be enhancing our painting skills and techniques. We will learn about strokes and how we can use different brush types to create different images. We will use this new knowledge when creating our very own Roman shield. We will paint a detailed design to scare our opponents and let them know where we are from!

As scientists, our focus is on scientific enquiries. We will be investigating a variety of topics and understanding what it means to take part in proper scientific investigations. We will understand many different keywords such as, prediction, hypothesis, fair test and variable. We will then present our data in different types of graph and table.

As mathematicians, we will continue to focus on time. We will then be moving onto all things statistics! This will include gathering, organising and interpreting different data types. Towards the end of the term we will move onto shape.

In Music, we will be focusing on Healthy Heroes! This will allow us to compose our own pieces of music and experience a wider variety of sound choices.

In RE, we are learning in depth from different religious and spiritual ways of life, relating to milestones on the journey of life. Through exploring baptism, Bar and Bat Mitzvah, Hindu samskaras and marriage we will explore how and why people choose to mark significant moments in life.
