## **Class News**

#### <u>Rabbits</u>

This week we read 'Rainbow Fish' and thought about the importance of being kind and sharing. We used adjectives in our writing to describe Rainbow Fish and made our own version of a beautiful, colourful fish! In maths, we have been recapping 2d shape work, creating models by joining different shapes and composing/decomposing shapes. In phonics we have been practicing writing words with adjacent consonants and reading our level 4 tricky words. We had a wonderful time at tennis on Monday and enjoyed a PE session with Hedgehogs as part of Rabbits' transition i



into year 1. We welcomed the new starters in for a transition session which was lots of fun and our Rabbits were super helpers, as always. We have learnt about the water cycle and where rain comes from, which we followed up with a 'Raincloud in a jar' science experiment! What a very busy week we have had! Enjoy your weekend!

#### **Hedgehogs**

Well, yet another busy and exciting week! In English we have begun reading a new book called The Little Gardener by Emily Hughes. We have enjoyed the story, learning about the environment, as well as being helpful to one another. We have also been learning about how to put commas in the right places in a list. In Maths we have finished our learning on Time. We have done so well to learn how to tell the time and to know how many hours there are in a day, how many days in a week and how many months in a year - a lot to remember and understand. We have just begun learning about 'Mass' and how to measure it. In Science we have found a new way to plant seeds! We are trialling a method where a Runner Bean is in a transparent bag, with water and tissue, in the sunlight to see if it can grow without soil....watch this space! In computing we tried to use our very own email accounts with not a lot of success! However, the children have learnt the purpose of email, using the keyboard and the terminology of emails. We did not give up though - we decided to type messages to each other on laptops, using the JIT5 'Write' and spent a happy time messaging to each other and replying! Stay cool this weekend! One more week to go!

#### <u>Foxes</u>

What a lovely week! In English we have finished our newspaper reports and made an excellent design. In maths we have been looking at angles and shapes and identifying different properties of shapes. In Spanish we made our own design of a zoo or farm to practice our knowledge of animal names in Spanish. In Geography we learnt about fairtrade, particularly focusing on bananas. In DT we designed our own healthy snack (and the packaging as well!) which was a fun lesson. We also had a lovely treat of seeing Badgers class play, which was AMAZING!!! Foxes had a great time during PE on the field and it is sad to see Josh go. We practiced our cutting and chopping skills through using bridge hold and the claw grip to cut fruits. The Summer Reading Challenge is a national scheme produced by the Reading Agency and delivered by public libraries that encourages children to keep reading during the school summer holidays - and to enjoy anything they like to read! Children aged 4-11 are invited to take part and collect rewards for their reading, giving them a positive experience of reading for pleasure.

It's **FREE** to take part. Sign your child up at www.eastsussex.gov.uk/src You can ask a one of our volunteers or a member of staff for help if you need it. The Challenge will begin in East Sussex libraries on Saturday 5th July and end on Saturday 6th September.

The Challenge is to read any six books borrowed from the library or downloaded from our <u>ebook library</u>. For children under 4 we have the Pre-school Challenge, where you can collect stickers for each book shared and a special medal sticker at the end.

Children signing up for the Challenge get a character sticker and a Reader Record.

Children will be able to collect a prize for each of the six books they have read. When they finish the Challenge they will get a certificate which they can receive in school or at the library. The Challenge is for all children, whatever their reading ability. Children who are not reading independently can share their books with a family member or friend, or they might prefer to listen to audio books.

To take part in Story Garden children need to have their own library card and PIN.

It is easy and free to become a member of the library. Take something with your name, address and signature to the library and you can join the whole family. You can reset your child's PIN online if you can't remember it, or ask in the library for a new one. You will need the PIN to sign up to the Challenge. W e have lots of free
